

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This Memorandum of Understanding is made in between

Party 01, Pillai HOC College of Architecture, Rasayani, hereinafter referred to as "PHCOA"

And

Party 02, Asian School of Architecture Design and Innovation, Silversand Island, Vyttila, Eroor South, Kochi, 682019 Kerala hereinafter referred to as "ASADI".

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is effective as of **10**th **day of January 2023** to establish an affiliation between PHCOA and ASADI for a period of upcoming five academic years. Both institutions agree to develop the following collaborative activities in the academic areas of mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity. A specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration will be agreed.

Both parties desire to promote and develop cooperation in research and education intended by this Agreement to establish a program of educational cooperation and faculty and student exchange as per following terms.

I. Faculty Exchange Policies

- 1. PHCOA and ASADI hereby agree to encourage academic cooperation through research and study in furtherance of the advancement of learning as stated below:
 - To encourage exchange visit of faculty from one institution to the other for the purpose of engaging in curriculum enrichment and research aspects, in online or offline mode
 - To facilitate and provide information on various certificate course option for qualified students from one institution to the other for the purpose of enrolling in undergraduate and graduate certificate programs, and in the case of advanced graduate students, participating in collaborative research
 - To foster the exchange of academic publications and scholarly information
 - To promote other academic activities which enhance the above-mentioned goals
- 2. Both institutions acknowledge that the visit by faculty and students from one institution to the other shall be subject to the entry regulations of the same and shall comply with the regulations and policies of PHCOA and ASADI
- 3. Faculty members in this type of exchange may be invited to participate in lectures, workshops, symposia, research, and special projects, as well as offer short courses.
- 4. Both institutions agree to review this Memorandum of Understanding after five (5) academic years following the date of signing and acknowledge that this Memorandum is subject to revision and termination at any time by mutual consent by both parties.
- 5. Both institutions agree that this Memorandum of Understanding is incorporated into, and will provide the foundation and framework for, projects developed by academic and administrative units from the two institutions and documented in other subsequent Agreements.
- 6. The two institutions shall seek to promote:

Faculty Exchanges

- The exchange of faculty to the mutual benefit of both institutions,
- Collaboration in teaching, research and development, and consultancy studies in the field of mutual interest,
- The exchange of academic materials and publications,
- · Conducting lectures,

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Undertaking joint research,

 Attachment of staff for purposes of curriculum development and review, attendance of courses, upgrading of teaching and research skills,

Participating in seminars, symposiums, and other types of academic discussions,

7. Both PHCOA and ASADI shall engage in mutual consultation and negotiation in the event(s) any major issue(s) arise in connection with this Agreement.

In the case of any irresolvable problems arising from this Agreement, either institution may terminate with six (6) months' prior notice, provided that exchanges in progress, or agreed to, are not interrupted. In addition, articles of this Agreement may be revised upon mutual consultation of both the parties herein.

II. Student Exchange Principles in Reciprocity

- (i) Exchanges shall be reciprocal and balanced over the duration of this agreement.
- (ii) In the event of an anticipated imbalance, either party may suspend or reduce intake or outflow of students to maintain the balance.
- (iii) Exchange students will be accorded the rights and privileges of regular attendance at the host institution

III. Other Areas

- (i) To exchange information on research and educational programs,
- (ii) To exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs,
- (iii) To organize jointly curricular events, seminars, conferences, or workshops on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- (iv) To propose and engage jointly in research or training programs and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- (v) To exchange, on a reciprocal basis, students at undergraduate, graduate levels for limited periods of time for purpose of education,
- (vi) The provision of cultural and intellectual enrichment opportunities for staff and students at both institutes,
- (vii) To permit students, staff and faculty members to use library facility, if need be

Amendments/Modifications

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both institutes.

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Adherence to Laws

Participating faculties, staff and students involved in any activities under this Memorandum must adhere to the law of the host institutions and their rules and regulations.

Legal Effect

Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

In case, there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, the parties will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

PHCOA and ASADI welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for cooperation and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.

For this purpose, the responsible parties will be the Principal of Mahatma Education Society's Pillai HOC College of Architecture, Rasayani, and the Principal of Asian School of Architecture Design and Innovation, Silversand Island, Vyttila, Eroor South, Kochi, Kerala.
