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1) Gender Equity Policy

64. Gender Equity Policy

Gender equality is an international commitment and recognized as a prime Sustainable Development Goal. Gender inequality, violence and discrimination are condemned as a form of human rights violation, a transgression of common dignity and an infringement on life and liberty as defined by the Constitution of India and fundamental rights. India's support for gender equity, sensitivity and equal opportunity are expressed in Articles 14, 15, 19(1)(g), 21 of the Constitution of India. India's ratification of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (in 1979) and the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW, ratified in 1993), Resolutions of the Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing in 1995 confirm the country's commitment to gender equity. This policy will be guided by the provisions in the following:

- Celebrate important days like International Women's Day (March 8) and International Day of the Girl Child (October 11) and any other.

iii) Policy Review and Implementation

- Review and update existing policies related to sexual harassment, maternity/paternity leave, and equal pay.
- Ensure grievance redressal mechanisms are accessible and efficient.
- Publicise these policies on college website and notice board to raise awareness.

iv) Gender-Sensitive Curriculum and Practice

- Integrate gender equality themes into academics for example "Women Empowerment Centre at Pali, Semester 3, 2023.
- Promote inclusive language (Marathi) and teaching methods.

v) Safety and Infrastructure Improvements

- Conduct safety audits to identify gender-specific infrastructure needs (common rooms, transport facility, sanitary needs etc.)
- Improve lighting, surveillance, and security in shared spaces.
- Set up suggestion boxes to gather feedback on safety concerns

vi) Community Engagement and Collaboration

- Host panel discussions with gender rights activists and community leaders, for example collaborating with COA, UGC, NGO(Soroptimist International Bombay Chembur and others) and counsellors.
- Collaborate with local organizations working on gender issues (Rotary Clubs and PHCOA adopted Karade village)
